Our membership is drawn from all branches of TESOL Education, including exam boards, writers and publishers of materials, course providers, teacher trainers and teacher educators.

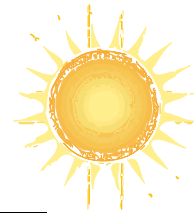
What are the aims of the association?

How much does it cost to join?

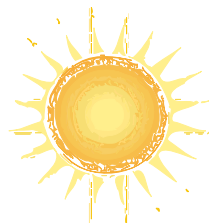
- £95 per year for institutions
